

Not illustrated. 1917 Excerpt: .depth and thickness of this important limestone, as recorded in local borings, are as follows: --(1) in the sandstone quarry at the east end of Cadzow Reservoirs, 5 ft. 7 in. thick at 9 fms. 4 ft.; (2) in the field 260 yds. south-west of Haspielaw farm, 6 ft. 4 in. at 22J fms.; (3) at Grindstonefaulds, G ft. 3 in. at 22 fms. 5 ft.; (4) in the field 200 yds. south of Cornhills, 6 ft. 3 in. at 33 fms.; (5) in the old lime quarry 400 yds. west of Browntod (Limekilnburn), 6 ft. 8 in. at 47 fms. These figures show that the Index Limestone is a well-developed aud regular seam in this part of the country. The Zyoncross Limestone is thin but nevertheless quite constant. It is seen at two points: the first is in the stream 200 yds. S.W. of Lochlinn...
