All current fiat money shall continue in use until the other forms of Coin or Paper-money provided in this Act are substituted. Second. The U. S. Treasury Department shall issue a new form of legal tender Note to ultimately replace all other forms of Paper-money, and these Notes shall be alike with Coinmoney - Full Legal Tender. Third. Silver and gold Coins or Bullion shall no more be held as sole money of ultimate redemption, standard, basis, measure, reserve. Fourth. About 50. 00 per capita shall be kept in circulation, i. e. , 45 00 in paper, and 5. 00 in Coin. Fifth. If any of the U. S. Papermoney shall fall below parity with silver and gold coinage, then such money shall be legal-tender only at its market value in U. S. silver and gold Coin - except to the Government and to bankers. Sixth. But any holder of such notes to the sum of 1000. 00, or multiples thereof, may return them and receive U. S. Coin; or, at the option of the...
