There were the Royal Sovereign and Royal William, of the seventeenth century; the unfortunate Royal George (with whose unhappy fate all the world is familiar); and a multitude of other ships-five three-deckers, built between 1765 and 1859, viz. , the Victory (predecessor of Nelsons), Caledonia, Queen, Marlborough and Victoria (the last two being screws); seven two-deckers, built between 1798 and 1859, viz. , the Foudroyant, Hercules, Albion, Agamemnon, Jean dArc, Revenge and Duncan (the four last being screws); eight sailing frigates, built between 1803 and 1848, viz. , Euryalus, Java, Cambrian, Raleigh, Arethusa, The model of this ship, one of the last of our threedeckers, and that of the Northumberland--then building for the Government at Mill wall--placed side by side, illustrated...
