As (e. g.) in Egoistic Hedonism (cf. Book iii.) the end of Self-love is so regarded: whereas according to the present method Self-interest (or what may appear such) must always give way to Duty. Still, within the limits fixed by other duties, Common Sense considers that Self-love is naturally authoritative over other impulses: and that it is a duty to seek our own happiness, except in so far as we are prohibited by strict rules of morality, or can promote the welfare of others by sacrificing it.
