Decorative Glassware April 2010 Subheading 7013. 10: Glassware of Glass-Ceramics Subheading 7013. 10 of the HTSUS provides for glassware of glass-ceramics. Material referred to as glass-ceramics is produced when glass is converted into an almost wholly crystalline substance by a process of controlled crystallization. These types of articles are produced when the manufacturer adds nucleating agents (e. g. , metal oxides such as titanium dioxide and zirconium oxide or metals such as copper powder) to the glass batch. After the product is shaped by ordinary glass-making methods, it is maintained at a temperature that allows the glassy body to crystallize around the nucleating agents (devitrification). Analysis of a sample by the U. S. Customs laboratory is necessary to enable U. S. Customs to determine whether a product consists of glass-ceramics. Although decorative glass articles are generally classifiable in subheading 7013. 99, decorative glass articles of glass-ceramics are classifiable in subheading 7013. 10, not subheading 7013. 99.
