

Material referred to as glass-ceramics is produced when glass is converted into an almost wholly crystalline substance by a process of controlled crystallization. These types of articles are produced when the manufacturer adds nucleating agents (e.g., metal oxides such as titanium dioxide and zirconium oxide or metals such as copper powder) to the glass batch. After the product is shaped by ordinary glass-making methods, it is maintained at a temperature that allows the glassy body to crystallize around the nucleating agents (devitrification). Analysis of a sample by the U. S. Customs laboratory is necessary to enable U. S. Customs to determine whether a product consists of glass-ceramics. Although decorative glass articles are generally classifiable in subheading 7013. 99, decorative glass articles of glass-ceramics are classifiable in subheading 7013. 10, not subheading 7013. 99.
