The author arrived in India in 1852 as a sub-altern, and rose through the ranks to eventually become the Commander-in-Chief. This memoir of his traces his career through times of peace and war. The Indian revolt of 1857 ? 58 finds special notice, as does the 2nd afghan war, where is distinguished himself and was subsequently called Lord Roberts of Kandahar. The book also throws light on policy matters, both civil and military, where the author is very open in his opinions. The book has 44 illustrations and maps, and is a reprint of the 1901 edition. from Subaltern to Commander in Chief19th century - Nineteenth century Frederick Roberts arrived in India in 1852 as a sub-altern, and departed in 1893 as the Commander-in-Chief. This biography is a soldiers memoir, and details all the military campaigns that he was a part of.
