The party on whose behalf the deposition is taken, or his attorney, may question the witness orally or he may submit written questions. In either case, the adverse party or his attorney may cross-examine the witness orally or in writing. In some cases the questions and cross-questions are all written and are prepared by the parties or their attorneys in advance of the examination. When this method is used, the examination may be conducted by the commissioner or notary alone. During the examination, any objection should be made after the question and before the answer is given. The commissioner or notary should record all such objections but make no ruling thereon. The witness should answer all questions.
