Sitting behind me is such a man, a professor in the Harvard Medical School, who makes all the diphtheria antitoxin supplied in Massachusetts by the State Board of Health. It is the best made in the country. Now there is no one in the United States competent to examine Professor Smith and give him a certificate of qualification for that beneficent work. Bishop Lawrence has referred to antitoxin; but he did not mention that in Massachusetts...
