

In the steel and iron business we find that steel bars are moving rapidly. In the past ten days between 400,000 and 500,000 tons of steel bars have been sold. This improvement is not reflected in other lines of finished steel, but these things usually improve by a process of rotation, and we may expect better things a little later. There is also some increase in the employment of labor. About 3,000 men have been put to work on the Erie and about 800 men in the shops at Buffalo, Rochester and Pittsburg.
