Total U.S.-China trade rose from \$5 billion in 1980 to \$147 billion i n 2002. China i s n o w the fourth-largest U.S. trading partner. With a huge population and a rapidly expanding economy, China is a potentially huge market for U.S. exporters. Yet, U.S.-China commercial relations have been strained by a number of issues, including a surging U.S. trade deficit with China (\$102.3 billion in 2002), China s restrictive trade and investment practices, and its failure to provide adequate protection for U.S. intellectual property rights (IPR). During the 1990s, the United States actively pressed China to liberalize its trade regime and improve protection of U.S. IPR. Under the threat of U.S. trade sanctions, China signed bilateral trade agreements with the United States on market access (1992) and IPR protection (1992 and 1995). These agreements produced mixed results. In recent years, the U.S. has sought to use China s application to join the World Trade Organization (WTO) to gain greater market access in China.
