Brand New Book ***** Print on Demand *****.Frances Ellen Watkins Harper (1825-1911) born to free parents in Baltimore, Maryland, was an African American abolitionist and poet. Her first volume of verse, *Forest Leaves*, was published in 1845, the book was extremely popular and over the next few years went through 20 editions. In 1850, she started working in Columbus, Ohio as a schoolteacher. Three years later in 1853, she joined the American Anti-Slavery Society and became a travelling lecturer for the group. She was also a strong supporter of prohibition and woman s suffrage. In 1892, she published a novel about a rescued black slave and the Reconstructed South, called *Iola Leroy*; or, *Shadows Uplifted* one of the first books published by an African American. Later, she wrote *Minnie s Sacrifice*, *Sowing and Reaping* and *Trial and Triumph*. Harper was a strong supporter of women s suffrage and was a member of the American Woman Suffrage Association (AWSA).
