Excerpt from Some New and Important Plant Disease Occurrences and Developments in the United States in 1953 Another hot, dry period from early September to mid-october intensified and extended the drought over practically the entire Country, except the far Southeast, middle and northern Pacific coastal sections, and a few local areas. During this period about one - half the total area of the Country received less than 25 percent of normal rainfall and some sections less than 10 percent. This severely afflicted area included the Ohio and middle Mississippi Valleys, most of Missouri and Iowa, a narrow belt extending from southern Minnesota southwestward to northern Nevada, extreme southern California and Arizona, and southwestern New Mexico. Widespread rains in late October alleviated the drought from Virginia northward through New England and brought limited relief to an area extending from northern Mississippi, Arkansas, and Missouri to Michigan, western portions of the northern Great Plains, and middle Rocky Mountain sections. Moderate to heavy precipitation from the eastern Great Plains to the Atlantic Coast during the third week of November and the first week of December...
