The essays in the three-volume series, Explaining Indian Democracy: A Fifty-Year Perspective, 1956-2006, span over five decades of the Rudolphs scholarship on Indian politics. The first published essay analyses the results of one of the first random sample surveys done in India. The last argues for methodological pluralism and situated knowledge in American political science as against the universal methodological and knowledge claims of rational choice. The essays in The Realm of Ideas: Inquiry and Theory, like those in its companion volumes, The Realm of Institutions: State Formation and Institutional Change and The Realm of the Public Sphere: Identity and Policy, contextualize and assess the democratic experience in India. The chapters in The Realm of Ideas, the first of the three volumes, explore how modes of inquiry, kinds of knowledge, construction of categories, and historical context shape political analysis and explanation.
