As a commentator on Aristotle s Poetics, Castelvetro stands out in modern times with Butcher and St. Hilaire. In certain details he sees the real import of Aristotle s ideas more clearly than Aristotle himself; in every respect he has a juster notion of the Poetics than all of his contemporaries. In aesthetic theory itself Castelvetro s case seems irretrievable. He never attained to solid fundamental principles; he fluctuates and gropes, showing moments of keen vision and moments of absurdity. Here...
