He addresses his work to the clergy because of their crucial role in instructing other believers, saying, whatever is essential to Christian salvation, if either neglected, overlooked, or mistaken by them [the clergy], is of the saddest consequence both to themselves and the churches in which they minister. William Law was passionate in this, his final work—passionate about the absolute power of God's Spirit and the fundamentals at the heart of Christian belief.
